District Profile

Dolpa district extends beyond the Himalayas and onto the Tibetan Plateau in the north. The northern Dolpa people are ethnically Tibetan and follow the ancient Bon religion. The remote region has preserved its Tibetan culture in relatively pure form. This area is sparsely populated and most inhabitants engage in agro-pastoral activities. Dunai is the district headquarters of Dolpa and lies in the southern part of the district. Total of 23 VDCs in Dolpa, Chharke, Tinje, Saldang and Bhijar share their boundaries with Tibet. It takes approximately 4 days on foot from the border to the district headquarters. The district is not connected by road and the only way to reach Dolpa is by air or by foot.

Program

On November 22, 2017, HURON team conducted training at Dhune of Dolpa district. During the inaugural ceremony, the guests were honorable Dolpa Program Coordinator Subha Kumari Karki, and CDO Kumar Bahadur Khadka Kumari. The opening ceremony began at 9 am in the morning. District level training was started after the opening ceremony.

Training attendees were District officers, Village development committee members, teachers, and students, representatives from political parties, media persons, NGOs and civil society members, armies, police personnel, armed police force and Ward President. There were 50 attendees during the inaugural ceremony.

Training session began at around right after the opening ceremony. There were total 45 participants where HURON members, Media Personnel, Security personnel (Nepal police and Armed Police Force), students, teachers and Ward members were attended. Out of 45 participants 11 were female and 34 were male.

The training templates which were distributed covered Fundamental Rights of Nepal, Civil Rights, Good Governance, Gentlemen's Agreement, International laws and Regulations and Treaties, Federalism, Crisis Management and Sustainable Development Goals.
