District Profile

Rupandehi District, a part of Province No. 5, is one of the seventy-seven districts of Nepal and covers an area of 1,360 km². The district headquarter is Siddharthanagar. As per the national census 2011, the population of Rupandehi was 880,196. The district is divided into seven election constituencies area, 17 Ilaka, 48 VDCs, 5 municipalities and one sub metropolitan city.

Program

HURON training team conducted training in Bairawa of Rupandehi on 30th October, 2017. The opening ceremony was started around 8:00 am in the morning and concluded at 10 am. The opening ceremony was chaired by Rupandehi Vice Chairperson Mr Bikuntha Raj Koirala and Chief Guest was HURON President Mr. Indra Aryal and other guests were HURON General Secretary, Political Members, and Representatives from Security personnel, NGOs and Civil Society members. There were 60 attendees during the opening ceremony.

Training session began at around right after the opening ceremony. There were total 52 participants where HURON members, Media Personnel, Security personnel (Nepal police and Armed Police Force), students, teachers etc. were attended. Out of 52 participants 10 were female and 42 were male.

The training templates which were distributed covered Fundamental Rights of Nepal, Civil Rights, Good Governance, Gentlemen's Agreement, International laws and Regulations and Treaties, Federalism, Crisis Management and Sustainable Development Goals.
